
It seems that every time I turn around this church is up to something to show their love for one another and for our community. It's wonderful to see.








STEWARDSHIP

Stewards of our Natural World



"God saw everything that God had made, and indeed, it was very good." –Genesis 1:31

Type "glacier loss" into an internet search engine, examine photos of ice sheets today versus just a few decades ago, and you will draw the same conclusion as the world's best scientists: We are losing ice, and fast. But melting glaciers is just one of the many crises facing our natural world. Stressed by warming temperatures, rising sea levels, shifting weather patterns, acidifying ocean waters, and pollution of land, air and water, nature itself is under grave threat. Thousands of species of insects, plants and animals are going extinct as habitat, from coral reefs to rainforests to estuaries, is destroyed.

"Our planet is in crisis," says campaignfornature.org. "The natural world is disappearing at an unprecedented rate."

For God's people, appointed as caretakers of God's creation, this is not just troubling news but also a call to action. Let's dedicate ourselves to learning about and fighting for God's creation. Here are some ideas:
